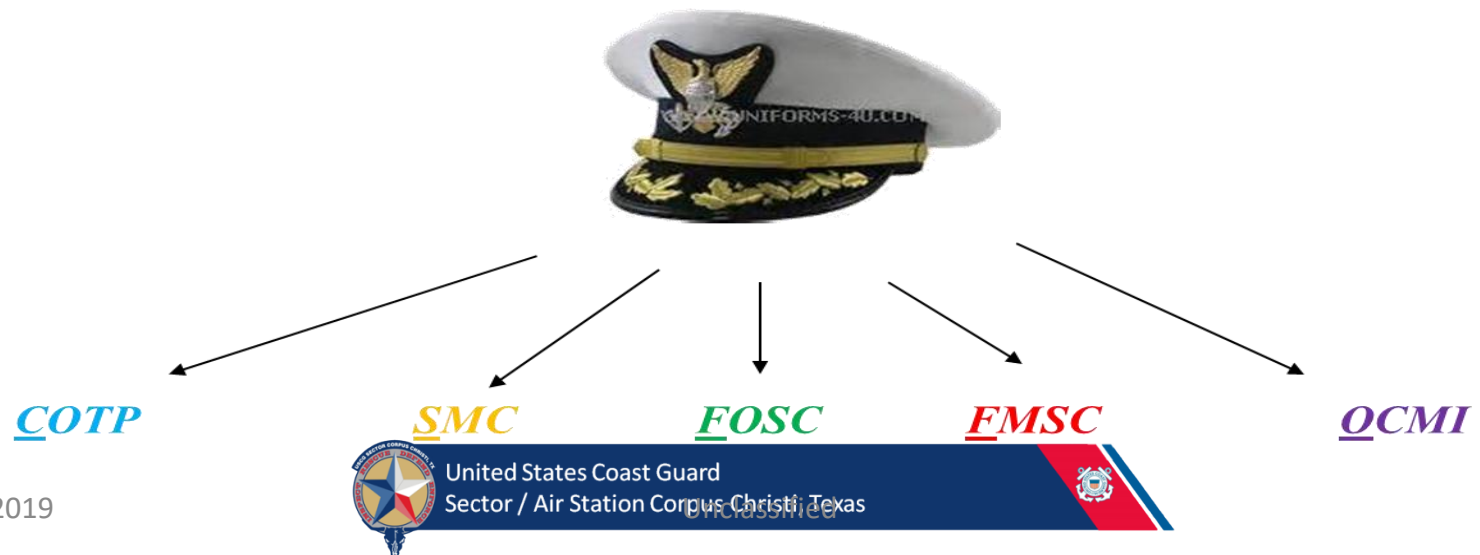

Organization Overview

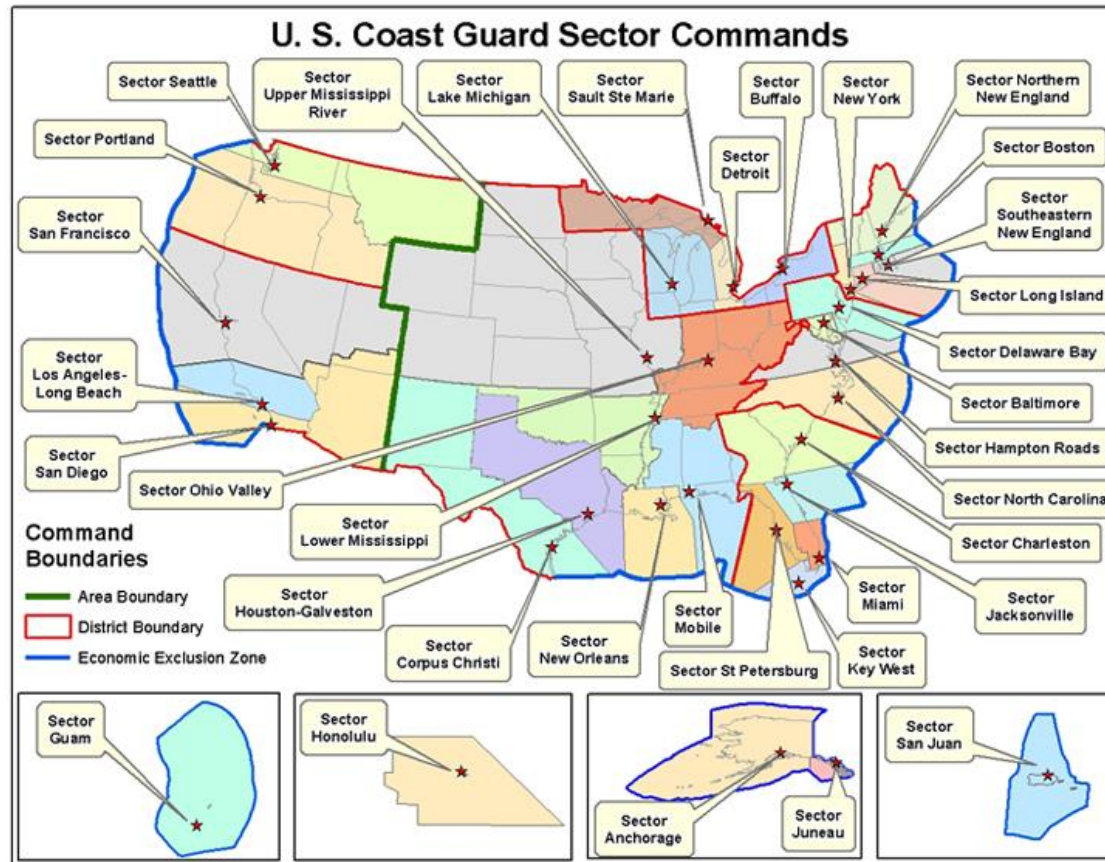
- Sector Commander – Regional operational commander of all Coast Guard missions within a particular Sector and holds the following authorities:

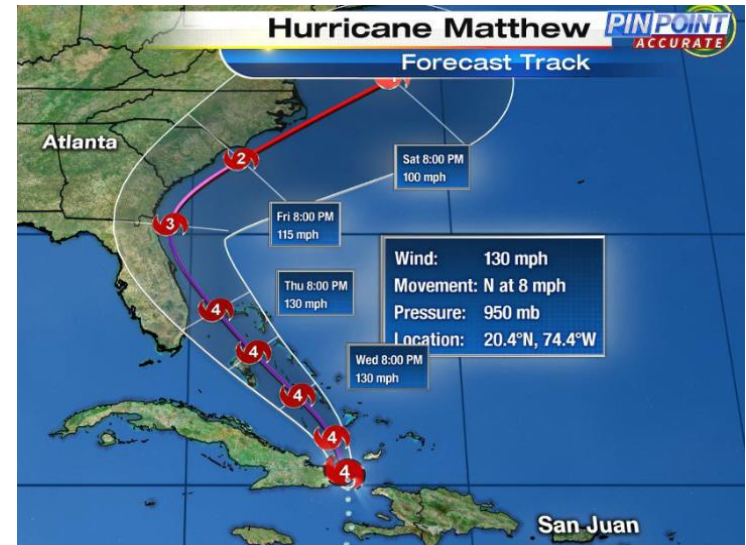
