

ON-DOCK RAIL: FREIGHT RAIL ACCESS

- PortMiami-FEC partnership cargo can reach 70% of US population in 1-4 Days
- Cargo can reach SE population
 (23% of US consumers) in 2 days
- Florida to become the 3rd most populous state – 19 million residents and 90 million visitors and is expected to reach 100 million visitors in 2015
