



## **MINUTES OF THE INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE MEETING**

Tom Armstrong, Chairman of the Information Technology Committee, called the meeting to order at 8:10 AM. The individuals listed on the attached roster were present at the meeting.

The meeting began with Tom Armstrong welcoming the committee and its six new members. Introductions were made around the table by each attendee. Mr. Armstrong also thanked Cris Mowrey and the North Carolina State Ports Authority for hosting the meeting.

The first agenda item discussed was InfoTech Committee business. The minutes from the last meeting were referenced and reviewed with no changes. Mr. Armstrong briefly discussed the success of the IT Competition and congratulated the winners, Pam Everitt from South Carolina State Ports Authority and Louis Noriega from the Port of Miami.

Next, Scott Brotemarkle explained the draft Committee Action Plan that was included in the meeting materials. The committee agreed that the draft could be made final and submitted to the Executive Committee. Mr. Armstrong stressed the importance of continuing to work on the document at every committee meeting in order to fine tune the committee's evolving mission and goals.

The draft Port Technology survey was made available for comments and changes. It was agreed that the survey would be made available for the committee members to complete with a deadline of **December 1, 2002** and based on that feedback, committee members Bill Sutton (Georgia Ports Authority) and Debbie Givens (Port of Tacoma) would fine tune the survey with their perspectives (landlord vs. operating port). The possibility of having the results available to committee members only was also discussed.

The joint IT Committee/Operations Committee/IANA seminar was discussed briefly. The committee generally agreed with the draft topics that came out of the discussions with the Operations Committee.



Some new ideas for topics included:

- ID and Access Systems
- Supply Chain Logistics: Data Ownership – Who Controls/Owns the data? - possible speaker from Wal-Mart/Georgia Pacific
  - o Customs (CTPAT – ACE Update)
- Getting speakers from Container Lines on various issues
- Maritime/Rail Needs
- What does Operations need from IT and vice-versa (good structure/moderated discussion)
- Cooling Systems (Operations/IT implications)
- Federal Technology Update
  - o OMB to clear up ITDS, ACE, other initiatives
  - o Janet Pence – ACE Update

It was agreed that after discussions with IANA and the Operations Committee, the committee would regroup by e-mail and phone to choose moderators and speakers for the appropriate panels.

After a break, Mary Beth Long from AAPA's staff called in to the meeting and gave a Federal Update on security initiatives and other topics of interest to the committee. Following the update, Lisa Himer expanded on some of the security aspects of the discussion including the Transportation Workers Identification Card (TWIC) initiative.
