Port Performance Act

- Who has to report:
 - the Nation's top 25 ports by tonnage;
 - the Nation's top 25 ports by foot equivalent unit;
 - the Nation's top 25 ports by dry bulk.
- Data collection: Monthly
- Reporting frequency: Annually
- Report to Bureau of Transportation Statistics





Performance Measures

- 1. the average number of lifts per hour of containers by crane;
- 2. the average vessel turn time by vessel type;
- 3. the average cargo or container dwell time;
- 4. the average truck time at ports;
- 5. the average rail time at ports;
- 6. any additional metrics, as determined by the Director after receiving recommendations from the working group.

- (M) 1 representative from a port authority;
- (N) 1 representative from a terminal operator
- (O) representatives of the National Freight Advisory Committee of the Department; and
- (P) representatives of the Transportation Research Board of the National Academies.
