What HAS Changed?

- On the surface ABSOLUTELY NOTHING!!
- ■99% of changes are invisible to normal operations.



What HASN'T Changed?

33 CFR Part 126: Handling Dangerous
 Cargo at Waterfront Facilities





Reality

- Limited changes.
 - "Incorporation by Reference" (i.e. Fire Fighting Regs)

Rather than two pages of aisle descriptions and cargo layouts, we have:

"Cargo, freight, merchandise, and other items or material on the facility must be arranged to provide access for firefighting and clearance for fire prevention according to NFPA 307, chapter 8-5."



The Regs

- Designated Smoking Areas!!
- Garbage/Flammables/Fires on the Facility.
- Lighting if Transfer of HAZMAT Occurs at Night (NFPA 70).
- International Shore Connection.
- Access to Facility not Impeded (Emergency Vehicles).



The Regs (continued)

- Motorized Vehicles (NFPA 307).
- Rubbish and Waste Materials.
- Arrangement of Cargo/Freight.
- Electrical Systems (NFPA 70).
- Heating Equipment/Sources of Ignition.
- Maintenance Stores and Supplies.
