- Short on staff
- Backlog is high
- Non-responsive
- Not consistent
- Timeliness is lacking



- Increased staff from 96 to 120
- Reduced backlog of pending applications from 3,500 to 1,900
- Working on a centralized phone system to improve response time
- Supervisors in each field office



- The reduction in backlog has enabled us to move other projects forward more timely
- Closer tracking of project timeframes through database status reports



- Designated one position to handle enforcement and compliance
- Hold monthly interagency preapplication meetings
- Hold bi-annual meetings with state agency heads to discuss project status

- Develop functional assessment methodology for wetland functions and value for use in the Caribbean
- Develop process for In-Lieu-Fee and mitigation banking
- Single POC between Corps and agencies
