Good morning ladies and gentlemen. Mr. Chairman, distinguished leaders, port colleagues and my own Board of Commissioners of the Canaveral Port Authority. In today's times of economic struggle, ports are important. I can view Space Shuttle launches from my office. And in less than a year, those launches will end. Forever. And thousands of people will need jobs.

And while our region is losing space jobs, Port Canaveral will create hundreds of new jobs by 2012 just through business commitments already in hand. And that's why we do this. Because it means something.

But if that is not enough reason for us to be in the Port industry, it is because we also get to come to these great conventions once a year in wonderful places like Halifax.

So enjoy this beautiful area, but mark your calendars for 2013, when Port Canaveral and Orlando and Cocoa Beach will welcome you to another great convention, in a wonderful place, for a magical time. We promise. Thank you.
