

These rain gardem are designed to filter out participants from the terminal and huldings that would otherwise flow into Commencement Bay. They are the first industrial rain gardens in the South Sound, and will tread over a quarter million gatters of stormwake each year. Fibering out heavy metals helps an mean tour MPDES permit requirements and penters wild adminis. Several partners and sponsors made this project possible, including more than 75 volumeers who helped plant 800 plants in April of 2011.

What is a Rain Garden?

A rain garden is a shallow depression planted with a variety of flowers, strudys and groups that 'don't mind getting their feet wet.' Rain gardens help seak up polluted runoff from routhops and powel surfaces while protecting our local waterways. When planted with the right types of plants, rain gardem also attract bris, butterflies and bees.




