Undue Preference Cases

- Maher Terminals v. PANYNJ, Dkt. 08-03
 - Started as dispute between APMT and the Port over Port's duty to turn over land that Maher had not yet vacated
 - Port third-partied in Maher for refusing to vacate
 - Original case settled: the tail of the dog lives on



The issues

- Undue prejudice claims
 - From lease terms years ago
 - Alleged rent differential based on square footage – a standardless claim that should concern every port
 - Investment requirement
 - Throughput requirement



Discovery Lessons

- A million emails
- Trying the discovery, not the merits
- An ancient curse may you have a lawsuit in which you are right
- Takeaway from Judge Guthridge's rulings
 - AS SOON AS YOU LOCATE AN INADVERTANT PRODUCTION, NO SLEEPING UNTIL YOU GET IT BACK

More Unpleasant Development

- Docket 09-08: SSAT challenges a P3 project, alleging that the private partner was given a better deal
- Comparing a 15 year lease for a new terminal with a 50 year concession on an very old terminal
- Terminal costs very competitive issue



American Shipping, Inc.

- Barge Service Brooklyn to New Jersey
- Port discontinued subsidy
- Prior claim settled (or not)
- Does a port have a duty to apply for federal funds and earmarks?
- Allegations that PANY/NJ has a duty to subsidize a tenant say what?



11th Amendment Issues

- The 11th Amendment is alive and well and living in Argentina
- Prohibits private party claims against State ports
- Does not prohibit BOE enforcement of the Shipping Act

PRPA in the D.C. Circuit

- Three ways to establish 11th Amendment immunity in the D.C. Circuit
- Arm of the State
- State agent
- State liable for judgment
- Not everyone reads the case this way



Arm of the State

- Three part test for most cases
- Not case dependent either are or are not immune until state law changes
- State intent to provide immunity
- State control over entity
- Overall effect on state treasury



State Agent

- Under PRPA a respondent that is acting as an agent of a state is entitled to that state's 11th Amendment immunity.
- Tidelands Trust Trustee for the state
- California case law
 - Mosher
 - Hanson



Bridgeport Ferry Case

- Tariff on passengers used to pay for virtually all general port operations
- U.S. Court of Appeals for Second Circuit affirms finding that the tariff violated
 - Commerce clause
 - Duty of tonnage
- Legal fees tariff also a problem

Bridgeport Ferry Continued

- Other claim (right to travel) that is probably passenger specific.
- Did not reach 33 U.S.C. 5 no non-federal entity can tax a vessel in navigable water
- White water rafting cases barring taxes
 - Pennsylvania
 - Tennessee
 - Idaho legislature
