

  - ➤ Data/science-based




## National Ocean Policy






- Formed in 2005, recognizing regional ocean issues—energy

- Significant new resources for regional ocean planning








- Current work plan includes:

  - Extensive public engagement


 Build on recent efforts in MA, RI, and lessons learned (ORPC in Maine)

- Engagement
  - Premise: this is VITAL
