- President commits Executive Office resources to reduce gun violence.
- DOJ and FBI are assigned the lead on law enforcement training.



INVESTIGATIVE ASSISTANCE FOR VIOLENT CRIMES ACT

Attorney General directed the FBI "to assist in the investigation of violent acts and shootings occurring in a public place and in the investigation of mass killings and attempted mass killings, at the request of an appropriate law enforcement official of a State or political subdivision."



FBI's RESPONSE

- 1) Nationwide 2 Day Conferences for law enforcement executive management (Best practices and lessons learned re mass shooting incidents)
- 2) Table Top Exercises for LE, fire and EMS personnel
- 3) Provide Active Shooter Training

- Predictive Analysis (Pre-event and behavioral indicators)
- Incident Response



PREDICTIVE ANALYSIS

Active Shooter Incident General Findings:

Most occur in **small and medium size towns** -police departments limited by budget constraints and small workforces

98% involve state or local offenses, with no federal nexus

Averaging 12 minutes

Single shooter, primarily male, is the perpetrator

Stops when he hears or sees law enforcement, sometimes turning his anger or aggression on law enforcement

Patrol officers are most likely responding alone or with a partner

A third of officers who enter the scene alone while the shooting is underway shot by the intruder



PRE-ATTACK BEHAVIORS

There is no one "profile" of an active shooter. Many offenders who engage in targeted violence may display certain behaviors during pre-attack planning. These predatory behaviors may be observable to persons familiar with the offender.



PRE-ATTACK BEHAVIORS

UNCLASSIFIED

Some of these behaviors may include:

- Development of a personal grievance
- Contextually inappropriate and recent acquisition of multiple weapons
- Contextually inappropriate and recent escalation in target practice and weapons training.





PRE-ATTACK BEHAVIORS

- Contextually inappropriate and recent interest in explosives and IEDs
- Contextually inappropriate and intense interest or fascination with previous active shootings or mass attacks
- Many offenders experienced a significant real or perceived personal loss in the weeks and/or months leading up to the attack, such as a death, breakup, divorce, or loss of a job
- Prior to an attack, others were concerned by the attacker's behaviors



PRE-ATTACK INDICATORS

- Weapons acquisition/ preparation
- Cleansing and purifying
- Extreme recklessness
- Legacy token
- Violence against caregiver/ family
- Staging area

Advanced Law Enforcement Rapid Response Training (ALERRT)

- Developed by the State of Texas in response to the Columbine shooting
- Training for State and Locals paid for by DOJ and trained locally
- 100 FBI SAs to "train-the-trainer" school in TX so we can help train local officers
